SOLID WASTE SERVICES

RECYCLING SERVICES

BUSINESS RECYCLING

These items are recyclable and may be placed in your recycle bin or recycle cart:

PAPER

- Cardboard
- Junk Mail
- Magazines
- Phone Books
- Cereal/Cracker Boxes
- Newspapers
- Computer Paper
- Any White Paper
- Mixed Colored Paper
- Pizza Boxes
- Milk or Juice Cartons



GLASS

- Bottles and Jars



METAL

- Empty Aerosol Cans
- Aluminum Cans
- Food/Juice Cans
- Empty Paint Cans
(Dry paint is ok)



PLASTICS

- Most Plastics Labeled



(No Styrofoam)



IT'S THE LAW! BUSINESS RECYCLING

AB 341 Assembly Bill 341 (AB341) requires all businesses in California that generate 4 or more cubic yards of waste per week to recycle. Participating in a CR&R recycling program will assist your business in meeting the recycling requirement. Businesses may also donate, sell and/or self-haul materials to a recycling facility. Information about California's business recycling requirements is available from the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) at calrecycle.ca.gov/recycle/commercial.

AB 1826 Assembly Bill 1826 (AB1826) requires businesses to recycle their organic waste on and after April 1, 2016 depending on the amount of waste they generate per week. This law also requires that on and after January 1, 2016, local jurisdictions across the state implement an organic waste recycling program to divert organic waste generated by commercial properties. Organic waste means food waste, green waste, landscape and pruning waste, non-hazardous wood waste and food soiled paper waste that is mixed in with food waste. CITY OF LOMA LINDA PROGRAMS

MIXED RECYCLING Mixed recyclables such as: cardboard, mixed paper, plastic, aluminum, and glass bottles may be mixed together and placed in a recycling bin.

BULKY ITEM/E-WASTE/WHITE GOODS PICK-UP Items that cannot properly fit in your bin, such as a chair or desk, are considered bulky items and require a special pick up. Electronic waste (E-Waste) is anything with a circuit board or battery, such as computers, telephones and small printers. White goods (e.g. refrigerators, freezers) and electronic waste cannot be disposed of in your bin. CR&R will collect and properly recycle these items. HAZARDOUS WASTE Household Hazardous Wastes (HHW) are products that are flammable, corrosive, reactive or toxic. They are dangerous to the public and the environment. It is illegal to dispose of hazardous wastes in your CR&R containers. Hazardous wastes must be disposed of properly.
